Providing Equity and Access for All Students**

An Overview of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)

PBIS is a systems approach for establishing the social culture and individual behavior supports needed for schools to achieve both social and academic success for all students while preventing problem behaviors.

At this **introductory** workshop, participants will receive an overview of the research supporting Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). Results will be shared from districts and schools that have successfully put PBIS into practice. Information will be provided on the steps needed to implement schoolwide and classroom support systems for PBIS. Planning tools and specific strategies will be provided. Schoolwide Information Systems (SWIS) will be discussed as a progress monitoring and decision-making tool. Participants will see examples and learn how to develop Behavior Support Plans (BSP). An overview of specific strategies and targeted interventions such as Check In/ Check Out will be shared. Participants will see examples of Behavior Intervention Plans (BIP) based on Functional Analysis Assessments (FAAs) and learn how these are used in successful PBIS implementation.
