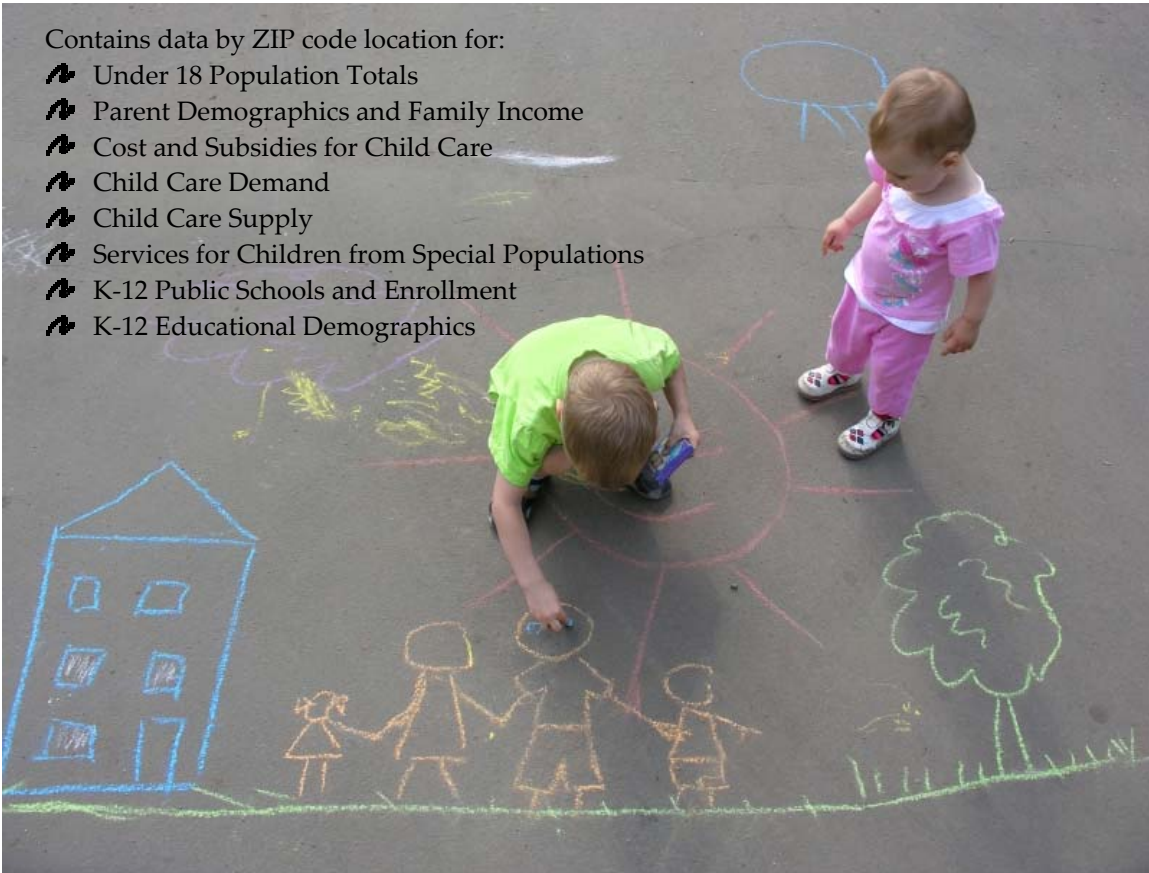

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Introduction

The Early Care and Education ZIP Code Profiles for Santa Clara County in this report were compiled by the Center for Educational Planning (CEP) of the Santa Clara County Office of Education. The ZIP code level profiles were requested by the Local Early Education Planning Council (LPC) of Santa Clara County to be used for strategic planning purposes related to early care and education. In addition to an overall Santa Clara County profile, 58 ZIP code profiles are included in this report which various city organizations may find helpful. Appendix A has a map that illustrates the ZIP code boundaries for Santa Clara County.

Methodology

Data provided are the most recent available and include the following ZIP code information: population, parent demographics, family income, child care costs and subsidies, child care demand and supply, services for children from special populations, and educational demographics with K-12 public schools and enrollment numbers. Data are from local, state, and national data sources. Data on population totals by age and ethnicity, parent demographics, and family income are from estimates compiled by Nielsen Claritas, a nationally recognized market research firm. In some cases, there are missing ZIP code data; possible reasons for missing data may be that schools or agencies did not collect demographic information for certain areas.

Population (Age by Race)

Estimates of 2007 demographics for children under the age of 18 are presented in this report. Children are grouped into four age groups: birth to four years, five to nine years, 10 to 14 years, and 15 to 17 years. Five ethnic/race categories are also presented: Latino, Caucasian, African American, Asian, and Other Race. For the 2000 Census, individuals were asked to identify themselves as either Hispanic/Latino or non-Hispanic/non-Latino, making these the two broad

ethnic/race categories presented. Included in the non-Hispanic/non-Latino category are Caucasian, African American, Asian, and Other Race. The Other Race category includes mixed or multiracial races/ethnicities, as well as write-in entries on the Census, and individuals of Hispanic origin (such as Mexican, Puerto Rican, or Cuban). The Other Race category also includes respondents who did not identify themselves on the Census as Caucasian, African American, Asian, American Indian/Alaskan Native, or Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander (National Atlas of the United States, www.nationalatlas.gov).

Parent Demographics and Family Income

Parent demographics and median family income are presented for each ZIP code area. The number and percent of families with children, as well as the number and percent of families in poverty who have children, are from the Claritas 2007 Pop Facts Database. Poverty is defined as living at or below the federal poverty threshold. For the year 2007, a family of four with two parents and two children under the age of 18, would be considered in poverty if their total income was less than \$20,650 (Oregon Center for Public Policy, 2008, <http://www.ocpp.org/cgi-bin/display.cgi?page=poverty2007>).

Cost and Subsidies

In Santa Clara County, the annual average cost of center-based care for an infant or toddler is \$14,454 and for a preschooler it is \$10,597, which totals to \$25,051 for both children. The average costs of child care for Santa Clara County are from data collected by the local child care resource and referral agency. The cost of child care as a percentage of family income is presented using the annual average costs for two young children (\$25,051). Information about per capita income and median household income are from the Claritas 2007 Pop Facts Database. Per capita income is based on average individual income, while median

household income is based on the income of the residents in a household. The percentage families may spend for child care is presented by per capita income and median household income.

Data on the number of free and subsidized child care slots, referral requests, and the number of children on the waiting list for subsidized care are from the Centralized Eligibility List compiled January 2008 by the 4C's of Santa Clara County (the Community Child Care Council of Santa Clara County) and the information was shared with CEP on April 2008. The number of children on the waiting list is considered an unmet gap in child care.

Subsidized Child Care

Monthly reimbursements for subsidized child care are based on the monthly average reimbursements rates for Santa Clara County and the available subsidized slots within each ZIP code area. At the time this report was compiled, the monthly reimbursement rates were the following:

Child Care Demand and Supply

Using a City Child Care Demand Model adapted from a recent study of early care and education conducted by Alameda County, this report estimates child care demand by each ZIP code area. The percentage of children who would use a specific

child care arrangement and the workforce participation of parents are based on data gathered for Santa Clara County from the *2008 Early Care and Education Needs Assessment*, a report completed for the LPC.

Information about child care supply for three different age groups by ZIP code area are provided for full- and part-time child care. Centers and homes that offered both full- and part-time child care were considered full-time. Child care supply information for center care and family child care homes, containing both subsidized and non-subsidized child care, are from the 4C's of Santa Clara County's Central Eligibility List compiled January 2008 and shared with CEP on April 2008.

Services for Children from Special Populations

The 4C's of Santa Clara County provided data in January 2008 about children in families receiving public assistance, specifically children who were in CalWORKs Stage 1.

Data, for the year 2007, on children with disabilities under the age of three and the number of children ages three to five years with autism were provided by the San Andreas Regional Center. Data of the number of abused, neglected, and exploited children (ages 0-17) by ZIP code area were 2006 referral numbers for Santa Clara County obtained from the Center for Social Services Research, University of California at Berkeley (http://cssr.berkeley.edu/ucb_childwelfare).

K-12 Public Schools, Enrollment, and Educational Demographics

Information about K-12 public schools, enrollment numbers, and educational demographics are from the California Department of Education's Dataquest Web site for the school year 2006-2007 (<http://dq.cde.ca.gov/dataquest/>).

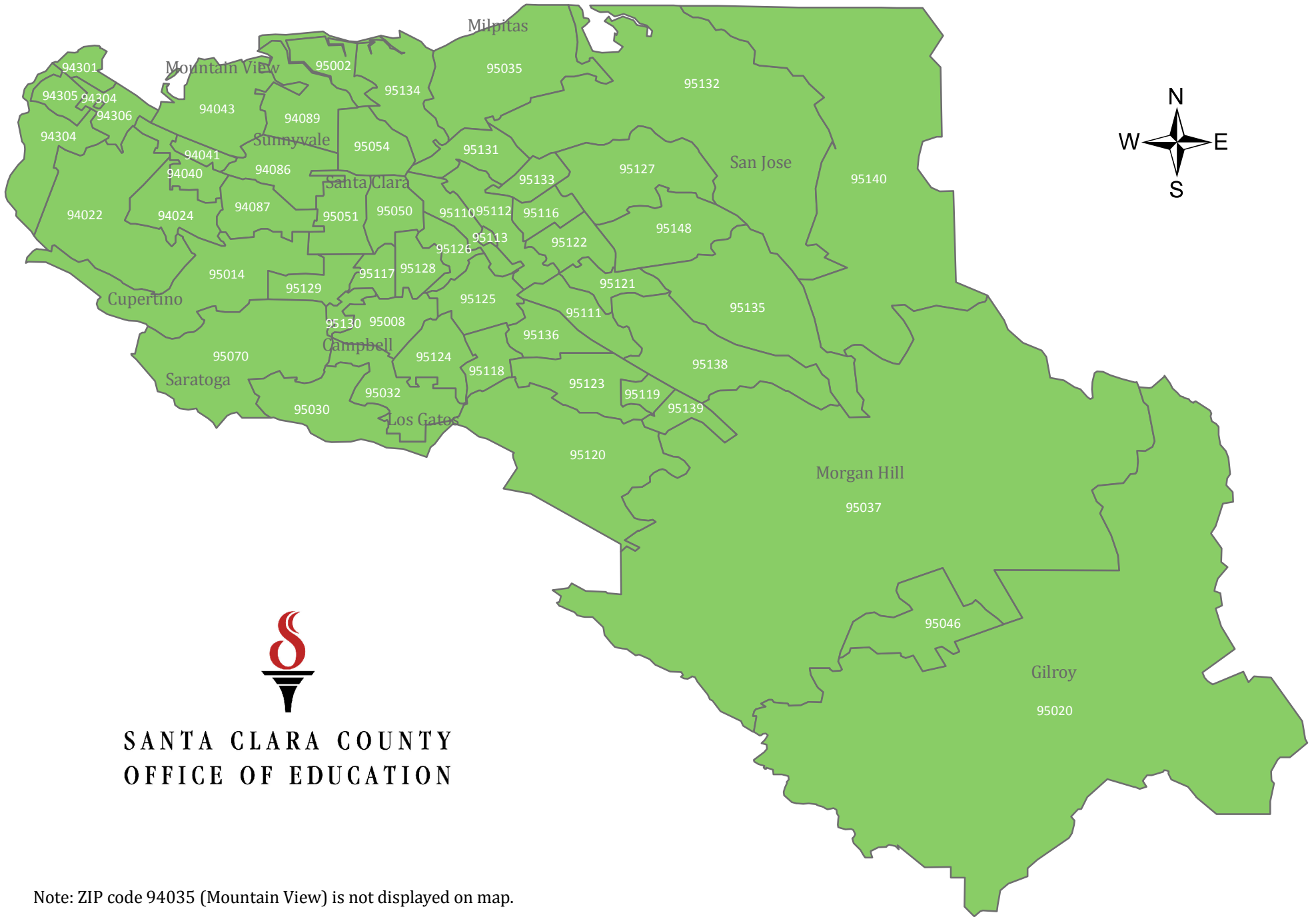
