Would be operated as a joint partnership by the State Department of Health Care Services and the Managed Risk Medical Insurance Board, with eligible children to be enrolled in one program or the other, as appropriate.</p> <p>Requires the administering agencies to request documentation to verify information only to the extent necessary to determine eligibility and as required by federal law and authorizes them to rely on income eligibility determinations made by other public assistance programs, including reduced price school lunch programs, the California Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), and the Food Stamp Program.
